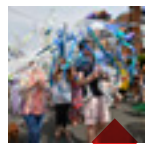

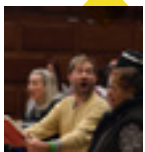
You are warmly invited to attend this ecumenical service led by Rev'd Simon Pitcher. Members of all the local churches have been invited to the service. Do come and join us.

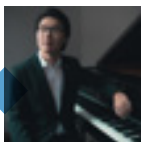

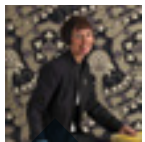

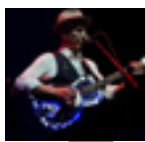


ALL HUNG UP

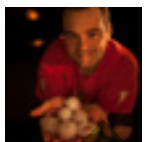


THE MARK FLANAGAN TRIO

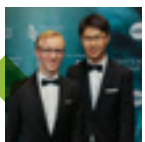

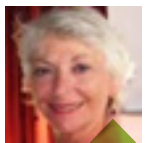

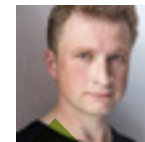
Both artists are studying in Cologne. They have taken part in the prestigious competition 'Schubert and Modern Music' in Graz, Austria and have a busy concert programme together.

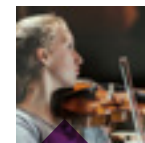


HANCOCK AND CO

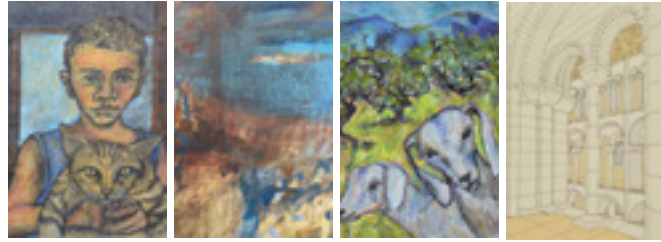
THE ROY ORBISON STORY BARRY STEELE AND FRIENDS

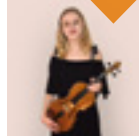

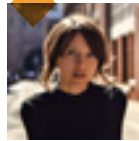

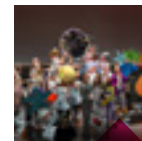


HANK WANGFORD & THE LOST COWBOYS
